"If within 60 days you are not notified of an arrest in your case, you may call the telephone number of the law enforcement agency for the status of the case."

As a Crime Victim, you may be entitled to compensation from the Alabama Crime Victims Compensation Commission.

You may be eligible if you meet the following criteria:

- You have been the victim of personal injury as the result of criminally injurious contact, or
- You are the dependent of a deceased victim, if such victim died as a result of this crime
- You did not cause or contribute to the injury or death of the victim
- An application is filed within one year of the incident
- The incident was reported to law enforcement within 72 hours
- You cooperated fully with law enforcement officials
- Your economic loss has not been paid by other sources

AS A VICTIM YOU ARE ENTITLED TO FULL COMPENSATION FOR ANY PECUNIARY LOSS, DAMAGE OR INJURY AS A DIRECT OR INDIRECT RESULT OF CRIMINAL ACTIVITY WITH DOCUMENTATION OF THAT LOSS.

Crime Victims Rights


Crime Victims are entitled to the right to be informed, to be present, and to be heard when authorized, at all crucial stages of criminal proceedings to the extent that these rights do not interfere with the constitutional rights of the person accused of committing the crime...

Amendment No. 557, Constitution of Alabama, 1901 (ratified January 6, 1995)

IF YOU ARE THE VICTIM OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, YOU ARE ALSO THE VICTIM OF A CRIME.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE OCCURS WHEN ONE PERSON IN A RELATIONSHIP THREATENS, ASSAULTS, OR USES ABUSIVE LANGUAGE IN AN ATTEMPT TO CONTROL THE OTHER PERSON.

NO ONE INVOLVED IN YOUR CASE WANTS TO BREAK UP A FAMILY OR RELATIONSHIP THAT WANTS TO STAY TOGETHER. ON THE OTHER HAND, EVERYONE WANTS TO STOP THE VIOLENCE.
