

Purpose

The purpose of this report is to provide a list of federal highway and transit funded projects obligated in the previous fiscal year. A project is considered obligated when a funding contract has been completed, or a grant has been awarded. This report includes all projects in the Decatur Area MPO Planning area that has been obligated in fiscal year 2023, which ran from October 1, 2022 through September 30, 2023.

Laws and Regulations

The laws that govern Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) are found in Section 134 of Title 23 of the United States Code and Section 5303 of Title 49 of the United States Code. The Code was superseded or amended by the Infrastructure and Jobs Act, November 2021. The rules that govern metropolitan planning organizations are published in the Code of Federal Regulations (CFRs) as Title 23, Chapter 1, Part 450, Subpart C. Section 450.334 specifically relates to the development of the annual listing of obligated projects.

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

The list of obligated projects begins with the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Federally funded projects must be included in the TIP. The TIP is a prioritized list of transportation projects adopted every four years by the MPO. The projects in the TIP are taken from the Decatur Area Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) except for certain level-of-efforts projects. The Plan covers a 20 to 25 year time frame, while the TIP extends over four years. Generally, the TIP divides the planned roadway projects into phases (e.g., preliminary engineering, right-of-way acquisition, utility relocation, and construction) and assigns a start date to each phase. The purpose of the TIP is to schedule the various phase for implementation.

Summary of Obligated Projects

A total of \$30,325,232.00 million was obligated in the Decatur Area MPO Planning Area during fiscal year 2023. Roadway Construction projects undertaken by the Alabama Department of Transportation and the Decatur Area MPO accounted for \$30,020,226.00 of that amount. The Centers for the Developmentally Disable North Central Alabama accounted for \$305,006.00.

Table Format

The table is sorted by project Sponsor. The Project Number refers to the Alabama Department of Transportation project management identification code. The scope represents the phase of the project. In general, most road projects are divided into preliminary engineering (PE), right-of-way acquisition (RW), utility relocation (UT), and construction (CN). Generally, the description starts with the type of work, follow by the road name. The Alabama Department of Transportation provided the project listing through their online portal program.

The amounts listed in the "Engineer Estimate" identifies federal funding amount. The "Fed. Obligated" column shows how much funding was committed so far. The funds in the "Fed. Expenditure" column represent what has been spent on the project. The "Balance" numbers are the amounts that have not been used. If a project is marked with a B/P in the last column it includes bicycle or pedestrian facilities.
