### MINUTES Decatur Metropolitan Planning Organization Policy Board 11-02-2023

### THOSE PRESENT:

- Item 1. Chairperson Garrison called the meeting to order at 10:03 am.
- Item 2. Approve the Minutes from the July 10, 2023 MPO meeting.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion to approve the minutes from the July 10, 2023 MPO meeting. Mayor Bowling made a motion to approve the minutes as presented with a second by Chairman Long. The motion carried unanimously.

### Item 3. Election of Officers for FY 2024

- Chairperson Mayor Bowling nominates Mayor Garrison for Chairperson with a second from Chairman Long. No other nominations. Mayor Garrison is approved unanimously.
- 2. Vice Chairman Chairman Long nominates Mayor Bowling for Vice Chairman with a second from Councilman Ladner. No other nominations were made. Mayor Bowling is approved unanimously.
- Item 4. Presentation Bethel Road and I-65 Interchange Traffic Study Garver Engineering

Patra Crenshaw presented on the Bethel Road and I-65 Interchange Traffic Study. She explained the method Graver Engineering used in the study. Graver looked at current conditions on roads and at intersection. They also reviewed crash data in the study area. After existing conditions were collected, Graver Engineering developed multiple alternatives including traffic circles at AL 36 and I-65 interchange, new interchange at Bethel and I-65 with new road connecting to US-31, and a Diverging Diamond Intersection at AL-67 and I-65 to help relieve traffic congestion along SR 67 and SR 36.

Item 5. Open Public Comment Period for the Bethel Road I-65 Interchange Traffic Study

Chairman Long motioned for the public comment period to be opened.

Senator Orr asked what the estimated cost of the alternatives are. Mr. Hellums informed the board of the estimates:

- Traffic Circles at AL 36 and I-65 Interchange \$3,000,000
- Divergent Diamond at AL 67 and I-65 interchange \$12,000,000
- New interchange at Bethel Road and I-65 w/ connector to US-31 -\$45,000,000

Chairperson Garrison asked if there was a motion to close the public comment period. Chairman Long made a motion with a second from Councilman Ladner. The vote was unanimous to close the period.

Item 6. Adopt Resolution 24-01 to approve the Bethel Road and I-65 Interchange Traffic Study

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion to approved Resolution 24-01. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilman Ladner. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 7. Adopt Resolution 24-02 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add the following project:

Resurfacing on SR-20 from 0.5 mile West of SR-3 (US-31) at the Railroad Overpass to 0.22 Mile West of 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue

Mayor Bowling made a motion with a second by Chairman Long. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 8. Adopt Resolution 24–03 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add the following project:

Section 5310 Transit CDD of North Central Alabama (Urban) Capital Rolling Stock (6MV/RL) FY 2023

Mr. Hellums explained that the CDD of North Central Alabama will be using this money to purchase new vehicles for their transit program.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Councilman Ladner made a motion with a second by Councilman Pike. The motion carried unanimously.

Items 9. Adopt Resolution 24–04 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to decrease the estimated cost on the following project:

Intersection Improvements on Vaughn Bridge Road at SR-3 (US -31) in the City of Hartselle

Mr. Hellums explained that this is a CN decrease for the Vaughn Bridge / SR-3 intersection. He informed the board on the process of increasing and decreasing the project estimating cost. A projects estimated cost will increase and/or decrease depending on project variables until the project is bid. When the project estimated cost is changed, the MPO director is notified and a new resolution is needed to update the TIP. He also stated that once the project is bid then the project cost is finalized for the TIP.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilman Ladner. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 10. Adopt Resolution 24–05 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to decrease the estimated cost on the following project:

Resurfacing on Bethel Road from Lynwood Circle to Kimberly Street, Cave Springs Road from Bethel Road to Sunset Acres, Skidmore Road from SR-67 to Cave Springs Road in the City of Priceville

Mr. Hellums explained that this is a decrease in the estimated cost for resurfacing of the above mentioned project in the City of Priceville.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilman Ladner. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 11. Adopt Resolution 24–06 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to decrease the estimated RW cost on the following project:

Bridge Replacement BINS 006153 and 001391 on SR-3 (US – 31) over Norfolk-Southern Railway (Limestone County)

Mr. Hellums explained that this is the latest right-of-way (ROW) estimate for the bridge replacement on SR-39 (US-31) of the Norfolk-Southern Railway in Limestone County.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Chairman Long made a motion with a second by Councilman Ladner. The motion carried unanimously.

Item 12. Adopt Resolution 24–07 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to increase the estimated CN cost on the following project:

Bridge Replacement BINS 006153 and 001391 on SR-3 (US -31) over Norfolk-Southern Railway

Mr. Hellums explained that this is an increased estimated cost on the construction phase of the bridge replacement on SR-3 (US-31) over Norfolk-Southern Railway in Limestone County. Mr. Ellis explained that ALDOT's plans are approximately 85% complete. He informed the board ALDOT is starting the ROW phase of the project. Mr. Ellis stated the construction phase is scheduled for fiscal year 2025.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Councilman Ladner made a motion to approve with a second from Councilman Pike. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

Item 13. Adopt Resolution 24–08 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to add funding to the following project:

Add lanes on CR-43 (Spring Ave) from Day Road to Cedar Lake Road South of SR-67 and West of SR-3 in the City of Decatur (Construction Closeout)

Mr. Hellums explained that this is a closeout cost for the Construction phase of the Spring Ave MPO project. He stated that the overrun cost can be associated with the length of time it took to complete the project along with unforeseen construction issues. Mr. Hellums informed the board this resolution will be to pay 80% of the overrun cost and the City of Decatur will pay the remaining 20%.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Councilman Pike made a motion to approve with a second from Councilman Ladner. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

Item 14. Adopt Resolution 24–09 to amend the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) to increase the estimated CN costs on the following project:

Structural Repairs, Paint, and Bridge Guardrail RETROFIT on I-65 Bridges over the Tennessee River, BIN 010882 and 010883

Mr. Hellums explained that this is an increase on the I-65 bridge repairs for the bridges over the Tennessee River, and this is a bid cost provided by ALDOT. Mr. Ellis explained that the start of the project is in the plaining stages. He estimated the project start would begin early 2024. He also informed the board that the project is estimated to take two (2) years. Mr. Ellis gave an overview on the work that needs to be done. He also gave an update on the possible traffic management issues and solutions.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Chairman Long made a motion to approve with a second from Councilman Pike. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

Item 15. Adopt Resolution 24- 10 approving the FY 2024 Highway Safety Improvement Program (PM1) Targets

Mr. Hellums explained that these are the Safety Improvement Program Targets from ALDOT. The MPO receives the targets from ALDOT. The goal of these measures are to improve traffic safety and reduce crash fatalities and injuries.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Councilman Ladner made a motion to approve with a second from Chairman Long. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

Item 16. Adopt Resolution 24 -11 approving the Updated 2020 Smooth Urbanized Area Map for the Decatur Area Metropolitan Planning Organization.

Mr. Hellums explained the MPO staff are encouraged to smooth the Decatur Urbanized Area after the Census releases the Urbanized Areas after the decennial census. This process is to make the Urbanized Area more uniform. He also informed the board that the functionally classified roads inside the smoothed area are then incorporated into the Federal Highway

Administration HPMS. Mr. Hellums stated the MPO sets the Smoothed Boundary.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Councilman Ladner made a motion to approve with a second from Mayor Bowling. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

Item 17. Adopt Resolution 24-12 to Functionally Classify Red Hat Road from State Highway 20 to its Endpoint at the Tennessee River to a Major Collector.

Mr. Hellums explained that the MPO staff have evaluated the road network inside the MPO Planning Area and have determined that Red Hat Road's Functional Classification qualifies to be changed from a local road to a Major Collector. He stated that by upgrading the Functional Classification of Red Hat Road it will then be eligible for federal funds and also add in making the MPO traffic model more accurate. Mr. Hellums informed the board that the MPO will request the Decatur Police Department to perform a traffic count on the road.

Chairperson Garrison asked for a motion. Mayor Bowling made a motion to approve with a second from Chairman Long. The motion to approve carried unanimously.

No new business.

### Item 19. ALDOT and MPO Staff News and Updates

Chairman Long updated on the MPO trip to Washington. He informed the board that the MPO members met with federal Representatives and Senators to discuss how the Census Bureau 2020 classification of Urban Areas affected the Decatur MPO. Mr. Hellums explained there will be a meeting with the Census Bureau in the future to discuss Urban Area Classification and the impacts it has on the Decatur MPO.

ALDOT Project Updates from Mr. Rodney Ellis:

- Hartselle US 31 project. Design is complete. ROW ongoing.
- Hartselle Lando Cain RD and AL 36 intersection project. Design 30% complete. ROW ongoing. Scheduled letting early FY 2025.
- Hartselle ATRIP project on 31. Construction is 30% complete.

- Hartselle Tap grant in downtown is 30% complete.
- Priceville resurfacing. Design is 90% complete. Scheduled for a February letting.
- Priceville TAP grant to install sidewalks along Upper River Rd and Bethel Rd. Design is ongoing
- Decatur Causeway Lighting Project. Environmental process ongoing.
- Decatur ATRIP II project at Upper River Rd and AL 67 intersection. Design is underway. ROW ongoing.
- Decatur TAP grant to update sidewalks on 6<sup>th</sup> Ave. Permitting ongoing.
- Decatur Church St. project is in the finishing stages of striping.
- Decatur ATRIP project on Beltline Rd. Project is 95% complete. Working to finishing drainage phase.
- Morgan County culvert project. ROW ongoing.
- Trinity ATRIP II project at S Greenway DR and AL 24. Design is 30% complete. Scheduled letting later FY 2024.
- I-65 TISMO project to install message boards and traffic cameras from Priceville to Athens. Design is 30% complete. Scheduled letting later FY 2024.
- I-65 bridge replacement in Lacon over Flint Creek and railroad. Design is 30% complete. Schedule letting FY 2025.
- Norfolk Southern Railroad Bridge crossing in south Limestone County.
   Design is 85% complete. ROW ongoing. Scheduled letting later FY 2024.
- AL 36 resurfacing project west of Hartselle is in the finishing stages.
- Emergency slide repair along AL 24 is nearing completion.

### Item 20. Adjournment

Chairperson Garrison calls for a motion to adjourn. Mayor Bowling made the motion with a second from Chairman Long. The meeting adjourns at 11:06 am.

### **Revenue Vehicle Fleet**

In FY2023, ALDOT's subrecipients of 5307 and 5311 FTA program funds had a combined fleet of 478 vehicles, including 56 minivans, 250 vans, 169 cutaway buses, and 3 full-sized buses. The FY2023 fleet has 42 less vehicles than the fleet reported in FY2022. This reduction is primarily due to cutaway buses that were either disposed or transferred to direct recipients in FY2023.
